## Join Us in Supporting Stem Cell Research & Cures in Kansas

Stem cells are unique cells that can turn into other types of cells, such as heart, muscle or nerve cells. Scientific research indicates that stem cells have great potential for treating or curing many diseases and injuries – such as **diabetes, cancer, heart disease, Parkinson's, Alzheimer's, MS, sickle cell disease, ALS and spinal cord injuries** – and that each type of stem cell has its own special characteristics and potential uses for curing different diseases and injuries.

That's why the overwhelming majority of medical researchers, medical organizations, patient groups and citizens in Kansas and elsewhere in the U.S. agree that *all* types of stem cell research should be pursued. This includes research involving adult stem cells, embryonic stem cells taken from excess IVF clinic blastocysts that would otherwise be discarded, and cells from somatic cell nuclear transfer, or SCNT, which is a technique for manufacturing embryonic stem cells that are a genetic match for a patient. Supporters of this basic policy position include such notable groups as the **American Medical Association, American Diabetes Association, Christopher Reeve Paralysis Foundation, Parkinson's Action Network, Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, Michael J. Fox Foundation for Parkinson's Disease and the American Association for Cancer Research.**

Unfortunately, some politicians and groups are trying to pass state legislation that would ban some of the most promising types of stem cell research in Kansas and prevent Kansas citizens from having access to future stem cell therapies. Any such bans would be unfair and harmful to Kansas patients and to our state's medical institutions and researchers.

The Kansas Coalition for Lifesaving Cures believes that any stem cell research, therapies or cures allowed under federal law should be allowed in Kansas, provided that such activities are conducted ethically and safely and do not involve human reproductive cloning.
